- Permit to Receive and On-Supply Alcohol Duty-Free to Permit Holders (NZCS 242)
- Permit to Import Alcohol Duty-Free for Approved Purposes (NZCS 243)

You do not need to complete this form if you are buying ethyl alcohol and paying duty on your purchase or buying alcohol from duty-free stores for travellers.

Q8 Use of duty-free alcohol

Handling and storage

Alcohol is a hazardous good. The storage, handling, packaging and transportation of ethyl alcohol must be done in accordance with all applicable laws and standards administered by other government agencies – including, but not limited to, WorkSafe, Environmental Protection Agency and NZ Transport Agency as applicable.

- I agree to comply with all applicable laws and standards for the appropriate handling, transportation, storage and use of hazardous goods.

Customs requires permit holders to have adequate controls to prevent misuse and theft of the alcohol purchased duty-free. How will you securely store the alcohol?

Record keeping

- I agree to keep records detailing the purchase, delivery, use, disposal and any loss of alcohol purchased with a duty-free alcohol permit, and to make these records available to Customs if requested or required by law.
