CUSTOMS AND EXCISE ACT 1996

CUSTOMS (IMPORT ENTRY) AMENDMENT RULES 2007

Pursuant to section 288(1)(d) and (12) of the Customs and Excise Act 1996, the Chief Executive hereby amends the Customs (Import Entry) Rules 1997.

1 Title

- (a) These rules are the Customs (Import Entry) Amendment Rules 2007.
- (b) In these rules, the Customs (Import Entry) Rules 1997* are called "the principal rules".
*(*CR 1D/1997, as amended by CR 1D/2004)*

2 Commencement

These rules shall come into force on 1 June 2007.

3 Amendment

Form C4G in Schedule 1 of the principal rules is hereby revoked and substituted with the form set out in the Schedule to these rules.

4 Rules to continue in force

Except to the extent amended by these rules the principal rules shall remain in force.

5. Status of Rules

These rules are regulations for the purposes of the Regulations (Disallowance) Act 1989.

I declare –							
1. That I, being a permanent resident of a country other than New Zealand, have arrived in New Zealand for a temporary visit of up to 12 months, and:							
(a) that this vessel will not be sold or offered for sale or otherwise disposed of in New Zealand without the permission of the Chief Executive of Customs; and							
(b) that this vessel will not be used in a commercial capacity for hire, or for the transport of cargo or the carriage of passengers for reward while in New Zealand; and							
(c) that I will advise the New Zealand Customs Service ("Customs") at the port of arrival of the vessel's movements and any changes to my postal address whilst in New Zealand; and							
2. That I undertake to pay Customs the sum of \$ being the amount of duty payable on the vessel, unless the Chief Executive is satisfied that the vessel has been dealt with in one of the ways mentioned in (i) to (v) below by (final date of temporary entry period)							
(i) Exported; or							
(ii) Shipped for export; or							
(iii) Packed for export into a bulk cargo container in a Customs controlled area and the container secured to the satisfaction of the Chief Executive; or							
(iv) Destroyed; or							
(v) Dealt with in such manner as the Chief Executive may allow; and							
3. That I understand I will be released from the provision of paragraph 2, unless otherwise permitted by the Chief Executive, once the vessel has been shipped to a point outside New Zealand; and							
4. That I will provide written notice to Customs of my intention to export the vessel not less than six working hours before the time at which the vessel is due to be shipped for export.							
5. That the particulars contained in this entry are true and correct.

NOTES

1. This form must be prepared in duplicate. The original copy will be retained by the Customs, and the duplicate copy must be kept and presented to the Customs when the vessel prepares to finally clear New Zealand.
2. The duplicate copy can also be used to demonstrate to the Inland Revenue Department that certain goods qualify for zero rating for the purposes of the Goods and Services Tax Act. More information on this issue can be obtained from the nearest office of the Inland Revenue Department.
