About this form

Use this form to apply to be an approved exporter under specified Free Trade Agreements as listed on the Customs website (www.customs.govt.nz).

Under the specified agreement, New Zealand approved exporters can self-declare the origin of their goods for export. Self-declaration is where an exporter (entity), for the purposes of obtaining preferential tariff treatment, completes and self declares the origin of their goods.

You must be an approved representative of the exporter to complete and sign this form.

You can complete this form by saving a copy to your computer. Information you have filled in can be saved as you go so you don't have to complete it in one session.

You can choose to print and complete this form by hand instead. Use a blue or black ink pen and write in CAPITAL LETTERS.

How Customs collects and uses your information

The information collected in this form is used for border security, data matching, immigration, statistical, and certain other purposes authorised by law. This includes use for border management and border related risk management purposes under the Customs and Excise Act 2018.

Under the Privacy Act 2020 you have the right to request access and correction of any personal information you have provided or that is held by border agencies. You may request access and correction through any office of the New Zealand Customs Service.

The information may be disclosed to authorised certification bodies, designated under section 435 of the Customs and Excise Act 2018, in order to assist Customs in its assessment of your application.
