As part of this assessment, we will also review your compliance history with Customs, publicly available information held by New Zealand Companies Office and publicly available information held by the New Zealand Insolvency and Trustee Service.

You will be advised if further information or documentation is required by Customs to determine whether you meet the fit and proper person requirements.

Providing incomplete, inaccurate or false information may result in delays processing a Customs-controlled area application, a Customs-controlled area application being rejected or suspension/revocation of a Customs-controlled area licence once issued.

How Customs collects and uses your information

The information requested in this form is collected under Section 60 of the Customs and Excise Act 2018 to assess whether you meet the fit and proper person requirements necessary to hold a Customs-controlled area licence.

This completed form and any accompanying documents will be stored securely with access restricted to staff who require the information for the purpose of determining whether you meet the fit and proper person requirements.
